In order that the Department Awards Committee may properly evaluate each recommendation, timely applications are necessary. *Your attention is drawn to the May 20, 2016 deadline by which all recommendations and applications must be on file in Department Headquarters.*

A SEPARATE APPLICATION IS REQUIRED FOR EACH AWARD.

ORIGINAL FORMS MUST BE SUBMITTED (or exact facsimile).

- B. Individual or special application forms apply to those specific awards identified at the heading of the form.
- C. When additional space is required please use other side of form. If further space is required use plain stationery of the same (8 1/2 x 11) size and attach to application.
- D. Do not use same programs for different awards. Apply only for what award calls for.
- E. News clippings in support of any award should be copied on 8 1/2 x 11 paper and include date.

DEPARTMENT AWARDS

The plaques listed below **MUST** be applied for and will be awarded for accomplishments during the 2015 - 2016 Legion year.

AMERICANISM

1. **THE JAMES A. WEIR PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post *doing the best work in Youth Activities* as set up in the Americanism Program, (American Legion Boys' State; Oratorical Contest; Scouting; 4-H Club; Baseball; S.A.L.; and similarly sponsored work), with the total accomplishments in any or all of these programs to govern the award. Information must be consistent with data on submitted CPR. The committee *may* opt to present two awards (*large and small post*).
4. **THE ARTHUR E. DALY PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post within the Department whose accomplishment toward *all phases of Americanism* is proven to be outstanding and which has taken part in support of Homeland Security within their respective community or the state. (Use **General Form**)
5. **THE JOHN P. GRIFFIN PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post judged as making the most outstanding endeavors in the field of Child Welfare.
8. **THE JOHN N. ROBERTO PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which under Awards Committee rules shall be chosen as having shown the greatest participation and work on the promotion of Patriotic Observances and Americanism in the local schools and community. Information must be consistent with data on submitted CPR.
9. **THE HENRY S. BIALOGLOWY PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the American Legion Post, which according to Department Awards Committee rules shall have made the greatest contribution to the display, promotion, presentation and education on the American Flag.
10. **THE RICHARD J. HEATH PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post and its Oratorical Chairman which according to Awards Committee rules, stimulates the greatest number of schools to recognize, sanction and promote The American Legion High School Oratorical Contest and results in the greatest number of students participating within the area of that Post.
11. **THE JOHN R. SILVAY PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which is judged to have presented the most outstanding program in the field of Law and Order pertaining to juvenile delinquency and the control of drugs. (Use **General Form**).
12. **THE WILLIAM MAGER PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post sponsoring the **MOST UNUSUAL** program in the field of Children & Youth. (Use **General Form**)
14. **THE JOSEPH F. MARDU PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post sponsoring the most outstanding School Awards Program as an Americanism endeavor.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

20. **THE ARTHUR J. KELLY AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post showing the greatest accomplishment in community services to *the benefit of the entire community*. (Use **General Form** information needed – **type of program, is it continuing, portion of community that benefits, Post sole sponsor or jointly sponsored**)

21. **THE SYDNEY P. SIMONS PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which is judged to have sponsored and activated within its community the most outstanding program of environmental beautification, improvement and betterment. (Use **General form** – information needed - # of people benefited, type of beautification, what was improved, cost of project – attach pictures or other enclosures)
22. **THE LEWIS E. WALLER PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post having shown the greatest participation and work in caring for homeless veterans. **Supporting material must be attached.**
23. **THE MORRIS L. ROBIN PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which has contributed the most through its membership or the Post itself to the promotion and recognition of law enforcement in its community or state.
24. **THE LEO M. HINDSLEY PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post having the best overall Community Service Program in their community. Information must be consistent with data on submitted CPR. **Two Awards: Under 250 members and 250 or more. Descriptive material is recommended.**
28. **ANNUAL FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE YEAR AWARD:** Awarded annually to that Volunteer, Call or Paid Fire Department of any town or city that while in the pursuit of their profession and by exceptional performance of duty brings credit to that Fire Department and the Community for performance in the field of public safety, Children & Youth, Community Awareness Projects and participation in Patriotic Observances.
29. **ANNUAL POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE YEAR AWARD:** Awarded annually to that Police Department of any town or city that brings credit to that Police Department for performance in the field of Children & Youth, Drug Education, Community Awareness Projects and participation in Patriotic Observances.

INDIVIDUAL

35. **THE POST HISTORIANS AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post Historian who shall register in Department Headquarters the most outstanding Scrapbook record or Narrative of the current years activities. (use **General form** - **Deadline JUNE 6, 2016**)
36. **THE DISTRICT HISTORIANS AWARD:** Awarded annually to the District Historian, who shall register in Department Headquarters the most outstanding Scrapbook record, or Narrative of the current years activities. (use **General form** - **Deadline JUNE 6, 2016**)
44. **THE HERBERT L. EMANUELSON PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the individual Legionnaire who has rendered the most outstanding contributions to Community Service. (Use **General form** must supply name of nominee, dues current in Post No., card number, year joined, offices held and **qualifications for Award**)
45. **THE RICHARD Wm. ANDERSON PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the Legionnaire who, having the foresight to seek and implement solutions to the challenges facing The American Legion Post of tomorrow, prepares his/her Post to accept those challenges today. Awards Committee will judge on individual merit. (Use **General form**)
46. **THE EDWARD J. CARNEY, JR. PLAQUE:** Awarded to the Legionnaire recruiting the most **NEW** Legionnaires in the current Legion year, (July 1- June 1), as verified by the Post and the Department Adjutant. (Use **General Form** and list new members with **ID numbers**).
47. **THE RICHARD W. ANDERSON PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that Legionnaire in the Department of Connecticut, who actively supports, promotes and participates in The American Legion Americanism Program as sponsored by the Posts. **Support material must be attached.** (use **General form** - information needed – **Name, # & location of Post, name of nominee, statement of activities with supportive material**)

48. **PETER LOUX "SERGEANT-AT-ARMS OF THE YEAR" AWARD:** Awarded to Post, District or Department Sgt.-at-Arms who, in the opinion of the awards committee, exemplifies the highest values of service to the American Legion, Community, State and Nation, along with excellence and leadership.
49. **THE ARTHUR ST. JOHN PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the individual S.A.L. member who according to the Department Awards Committee has been chosen as the most Outstanding Son in a Squadron of The Sons of The American Legion for the current year. This is to be accomplished by each Squadron (or Post) submitting a nomination to the Department Awards Committee who shall judge such nominations on the outstanding manner in which the S.A.L. member has contributed to the programs of the S.A.L. and The American Legion. **(Use General form- information needed – Post #, location, name of nominee, Squadron number & location, year joined, list of qualifications).**
50. **THE BOYD SAXTON PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the Post and/or District Chaplain who has exhibited spiritual guidance and performed the most duties of their office. **(Use General form)**
51. **THE NEALE V. CABRAL PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the Post Adjutant who according to the Department Awards Committee has served in an outstanding manner in performing his or her duties.
52. **THE LOUIS E. MOLINARO PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the Post commander who according to the Department Awards Committee has been chosen as being the most outstanding Post Commander of the current year.
55. **LEGIONNAIRE OF THE YEAR AWARD:** Three (3) nominations are preferred by the Awards Committee for the award to be made. Award is based on activities of nominee and outstanding and unusual service performed by the nominee to The American Legion during the year ending since last convention. **Current Department Officers do not qualify, except Ass't. Sgt at Arms, Sgt. at Arms and Dept. Executive Committeemen.**
56. **JOHN C. LAFONTAINE PLAQUE to the "Fire Fighter or Emergency Services Person of the Year":** Awarded annually to that member of any Volunteer, Call or Paid Fire Department who while in the pursuit of their profession and by exceptional performance of duty has brought credit to their Fire Department, the Community and to themselves during the current year and by conducting themselves in this manner has earned the highest respect of The American Legion, Department of Connecticut.
57. **LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE YEAR:** Awarded to the Law Enforcement Officer meeting the criteria specified on list following application (enclosed with this awards package or found at: <http://www.legion.org/security/officeraward>). If documentation requirements are met, then Department winner will be forwarded to National for consideration of National Award.

POST ACTIVITIES

75. **THE CHARLES J. MAJEWSKI PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which according to Department Awards Committee rules is judged to have the most all-inclusive Post activities program between June 1st and the subsequent Memorial Day. **Two Awards: Under 250 members and 250 or more.**
76. **THE HUGH C. GRAHAM PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which is judged to have had the most outstanding and diversified Public Relations Program to promote the best interest of all American Legion programs. **Supportive material must be furnished.**
77. **THE EUGENE W. FREEMAN PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which does the most toward encouraging interest and work on National Security at community and national levels.
78. **THE CHARLES E. HAAS PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the American Legion Post which has demonstrated the most in assistance to the "Lonesome Child". i.e. Assistance to needy children, especially at holiday time.

80. THE GEORGE D. BARON PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the American Legion Post which prepares and sends to its members the most outstanding and newsworthy Post Publication (Bulletins, Newsletters, Newspapers, emailed file) regardless of media (printed, copied, electronic). (use **General form** – information needed – **name of editor, number of members, number of copies distributed (traditional mail & email), media, source of materials – one full year of publication must be attached**).

81. JAMES A. LACOURSIERE, JR. AWARD: Awarded to the Post that best involves itself in the Heroes to Hometown (H2H), the Troop Support Services (TS2), the Reconnect Program, Family Support, and/or Operation Comfort Warriors (OCW). (Use **General Form and provide documentation of support and guidance to Veterans, Soldiers, and their families through these programs**).

82. THE NATIONAL GUARD PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the post that makes the greatest per capita contribution to the Connecticut National Guard Foundation, Inc. Submit **General Form** with a copy of cancelled check. Tie breaker – goes to the post with the highest percentage of their membership goal as of June 1 of the award year.

83. THE FRANCIS G. GARRIS PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which according to the Department Awards Committee has been judged to have exhibited the greatest effort in promoting the Scouting Program (any & all elements of BSA). (use **General form** – information needed – **Unit No., location, # of boys in Unit, # of Legionnaires as Scoutmasters, # of Legionnaires as Committeemen, how often unit meets, major projects, Cost of Unit borne by Post**), etc.

84. THE CHET D. HIRSCH PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which sponsors the best program in environmental ecology

85. THE REV. ROBERT G. KEATING PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which shall have shown the greatest accomplishment in religious emphasis of The American Legion during the current year, such as promotion of Religious Emphasis Week and Four Chaplains Sunday. (use **General form**)

VETERANS AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION

90. THE JOHN W. CLARKE PLAQUE: Awarded annually to *the individual American Legion Post Service Officer* who has excelled in service work by servicing veterans and their dependents in a manner that has brought outstanding records of achievement in securing claims and benefits.

91. THE JOSEPH G. LEONARD PLAQUE (automatic): Awarded annually to *the Post* whose Service Officer received the *John W. Clarke Plaque* by excelling in service work and engaging in or sponsoring rehabilitation activities beneficial to veterans and dependents of the community during the preceding twelve (12) months commencing June 1st.

92. THE RAYMOND R. BIGELOW PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the Post doing the most to promote the VAVS and RHVS programs in the VA Medical Centers and Rocky Hill. (use **General form** – information needed – **Post #, location, list of contributions made and events held [where?]**)

LEGIONNAIRE HALL OF FAME AWARD (MID-WINTER)

100. CONNECTICUT LEGIONNAIRE HALL OF FAME AWARD: Awarded at Mid-Winter Conference to those Legionnaires nominated by a Post who shall meet the following criteria: Member of the Dept. of Connecticut, current or deceased, with a distinguished record of volunteer service to the Post, District and / or Department and / or National. Selection will be by Hall of Fame Committee.

16. **THE ELIOTT K. BURR MEMORIAL AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post sponsoring the boy at Boys’ State showing the most outstanding participation in the Religious Program for the current session. *(Awarded automatically)
17. **THE WILLIAM H. JORDAN PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the Post sponsoring the boy chosen by the Boys’ State Commission who has combined the spirit of God and Country with the motto “SEMPER FI”. *(Awarded automatically)
25. **THE EVERETT G. SHEPARD, III PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the Post or Organization sponsoring the winner of the Department Commander’s award at State Police Youth Week. *(Awarded automatically)
26. **THE W. FRAZIER BRINLEY PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the individual raising the greatest amount of money at the Annual Walk-A-Thon for Connecticut’s Kids and our Children’s Miracle Network Hospital. *(Awarded automatically)
27. **THE DEPARTMENT BASEBALL PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that Post which shall sponsor the Baseball Team winning the Department Championship. *(Awarded automatically)
30. **THE MILTON E. MORITZ PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that *American Legion Post or other organization* sponsoring the Troop of the Eagle Scout chosen as Scout of the Year. *(Awarded automatically)

39. **THE WILLIAM J. LUCAS PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the boy elected as Governor of the current session of Boys’ State. *(Awarded automatically)

54. **THE HENRY MAYER PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the District Commander selected as “District Commander of the Year” based on a point system, which is on file in the Department Adjutant’s office. *(Awarded automatically)

60. **THE PHILO C. CALHOUN AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post of the Department, which is the first to equal its previous year’s membership. *(Awarded automatically)
61. **THE CLARENCE W. SEYMOUR AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which makes the greatest percentage gain in membership over the previous year. *(Awarded automatically)
62. **THE MORGAN B. HAVEN PLAQUE:** Awarded to that American Legion Post which has the greatest percentage of its previous year’s membership renewed by January 1st. *(Awarded automatically)
63. **THE HOWARD I. JACOBS PLAQUE (1):** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post with a membership goal of over 500 which on December 31st has the greatest numerical membership in the Department of Connecticut. *(Awarded automatically)
64. **THE HOWARD I. JACOBS PLAQUE (2):** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post having a membership goal of 300 to 500, which on December 31st has the greatest numerical membership in the Department of Connecticut. *(Awarded automatically)
65. **THE LEROY B. BUTLER PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post having the greatest numerical advance in membership for the new year on Veterans Day, November 11th. *(Awarded automatically)

69. **THE ELIOTT N. MORRIS PLAQUE (1):** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post with a goal of over 500 members which on the closing day of the Mid-Winter Conference has the greatest percentage of Quota into Department. *(Awarded automatically)
70. **THE ELIOTT N. MORRIS PLAQUE (2):** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post with a goal of 200 to 500 members which on the closing day of the Mid-Winter Conference has the greatest percentage of Quota into Department. *(Awarded automatically)
71. **THE D. JOSEPH JACKSON PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the American Legion Post, which is the first to achieve ALL-TIME HIGH status in membership in the current membership year. *(Awarded automatically)

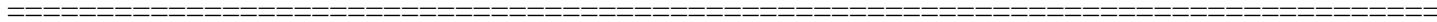

Dear Department Adjutant,

Each year, The American Legion gives its National Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award and National Firefighter of the Year Award to well-rounded individuals who have exceeded the duty requirements expected in their positions and have demonstrated a distinct pattern of community service coupled with professional achievement. These awards, which especially take into account heroic acts, are presented annually at The American Legion's National Convention.

Department Law and Order Committees are encouraged to select and honor a Law Enforcement Officer of the Year and a Firefighter of the Year at their department conventions.

Departments nominate their winners for the national awards by mailing an application for either one or both to The American Legion, Attn: National Security Division, 1608 K Street, NW, Washington, DC 20006.

Applications must be received by the National Security Division no later than **February 1, 2017**.

Departments may only submit one nomination per year. Only department winners are eligible for the national award, which should be accepted at the national convention.

For the National Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award: Nominees must be U.S. citizens and living, active, full-time and paid, sworn law enforcement officers entrusted with full authority and the powers of arrest and must be assigned to or fully recognized by municipal, county, district or state police; highway patrol; sheriff's office or as a sworn federal law enforcement officer (FBI, Secret Service agent, U.S. Marshal, National Park Police, U.S. Capitol Police, etc.). Military police officers or investigators are eligible if they are state law enforcement certified. Nominees must also reside and be assigned or attached for duty in the nominating department. Federal agents serving overseas should be nominated by the overseas department. Posthumous awards will be acceptable only if the nominee's death has occurred after the department's selection.

For the Fire Fighter of the Year Award: Nominees must be active firefighters and U.S. citizens. Emergency medical technicians (EMTs) are eligible only if they are certified firefighters. Nominees must also reside and be assigned within their nominating department's state. Posthumous awards will be acceptable only if the nominee's death occurs after the department's selection.

The American Legion will provide the National Law Enforcement Officer of the Year and the National Firefighter of the Year with roundtrip coach airfare for one or vehicle mileage, in accordance with its employee mileage reimbursement rates, staff per diem for two days, two tickets each for the National Commander's Banquet, and lodging for each winner for one night in accordance with travel policies of The American Legion for an individual recipient or a single representative of a group or organization to receive an award at National Convention.

These awards recognize law officers and firefighters who go above the call of duty. A major secondary purpose of this award is to encourage further development of department and post Law and Order Committees through continued recognition of law enforcement officers and firefighters. It is firmly believed these awards serve to promote public trust and support of our law enforcement agencies and fire departments.
