Dear Secretary McDonald:

Fisher House Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") is pleased to offer the Department of Veterans Affairs ("VA"), a completed project to construct and donate a guesthouse residence for use by family members of, and veterans receiving treatment at the VA Connecticut Healthcare System and their visiting families. The building will serve as a temporary residence and support facility for such veterans and their family members. The gift of this guesthouse referred to as "Fisher House" would be made pursuant to 38 U.S.C. § 8103 and 8104.

The Fisher House will be the third Fisher House located on the grounds of the West Haven Campus and will consist of a complete house with sixteen bedrooms or suites and several common use areas. The structure will be built according to the attached Basis of Design.

We are making this offer without any solicitation from the Department of Veterans Affairs or VA personnel at the VA Connecticut Healthcare System. Our offer to build the guesthouse is conditioned upon the following:

- 1. During its useful life, the facility will be used for the purpose of providing temporary housing and support for veterans related to the treatment at the VA and their visiting families and not converted to living quarters or other uses.
- 2. The guesthouse is to be permanently designated a "Zachary and Elizabeth M. Fisher House" and administered under your auspices with assistance as necessary or desirable from appropriate VA support organizations.
- 3. Once the guesthouse is finished and accepted by the Department of Veterans Affairs, the VA will assume, at their expense, all responsibility and liability to operate, preserve, maintain and restore the Fisher House in event of casualty.
- 4. The guesthouse will be constructed and donated by Fisher House Foundation, Inc., a not-for-profit corporation.

The anticipated period of time needed to perform the actual construction work will be approximately twelve to fourteen months (subject to delays outside of our control), and we will be able to set an anticipated completion date once the contractor has commenced construction.

We understand that by law this offer has to be approved by you, as the Secretary of Veterans Affairs. The construction of the guesthouse will not commence until after we receive the necessary approval.

The provisions contained in the attached offer of gift are incorporated herein.

We very much look forward to working with the Department of Veterans Affairs on this project.






