### FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1. NATO's largest military drill since the end of the Cold War is being planned for 2024, bringing together more than 40,000 troops for an exercise stretching from the Baltics to Poland and Germany, according to alliance officials. Steadfast Defender will be a testing ground for practicing intertwined NATO and national defense plans, Adm. Rob Bauer, NATO's military chief, said Saturday. "A new era of collective defense is upon us," Bauer said following a meeting of NATO defense chiefs. He called the exercises the largest in the post-Cold War era.

2. Iran and the United States will exchange prisoners on Monday after some \$6 billion once frozen in South Korea reached Qatar, a key element of the planned swap, officials said. The planned exchange comes just ahead of the United Nations General Assembly in New York, where Iran's hard-line President Ebrahim Raisi will speak. However, the swap won't mean that tensions have been lowered between the U.S. and Iran, which now enriches uranium closer than ever to weapons-grade levels.

3. North Korean leader Kim Jong Un was on his way home Sunday from Russia, ending a six-day trip that triggered global concerns about weapons transfer deals between the two countries locked in separate standoffs with the West. Kim's armored train departed to the sound of the Russian patriotic march song "Farewell of Slavianka" at the end of a farewell ceremony at a railway station in Artyom, a far eastern Russian city about 200 kilometers (124 miles) from the border with North Korea, Russia's state news agency RIA reported.

4. China's top diplomat is heading to Russia for security talks after two days of meetings with U.S. President Joe Biden's national security adviser over the weekend in Malta. Foreign Minister Wang Yi, who simultaneously holds the ruling Communist Party's top foreign policy post, will be in Russia from Monday to Thursday for China-Russia strategic security consultations, the Foreign Ministry said in a brief statement.

5. Russia on Monday called a Ukrainian case alleging that Moscow abused the Genocide Convention to justify its invasion last year an "abuse of process," as lawyers for Moscow sought to have judges at the United Nation's highest court throw it out. As a series of lawyers laid out Moscow's objections to the case, the leader of Russia's legal team at the International Court of Justice, Gennady Kuzmin, told the 16-judge panel that Ukraine's case that seeks to halt the invasion "is, hopelessly flawed and at odds with the longstanding jurisprudence of this court."

### FROM THE LANDING ZONE:

### The case for U.S. engagement in the world. By Alan W. Dowd

A central element of the mission of <u>The American Legion</u>, according to its founding document, is "to make right the master of might; to promote peace and goodwill on earth; to safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy."

This mission is as important and relevant today as it was in 1919, and it requires an America that's engaged in the world. That doesn't mean America should be hyperactive on the world stage. But to promote peace and safeguard freedom, America definitely needs to be on the world stage – active and engaged.

Headwinds. There are strong headwinds pushing against engagement. Just 20% of Americans favor engagement overseas; nearly 42% "favor greater isolationism." Fully 51% of Americans say the United States should pay less attention to problems overseas and concentrate on problems at home, up from 30% in 2002.

This is just the latest example of the tension that has long existed between the American people's desire to spread free government and their desire to avoid the headaches and heartaches that come with engagement. At its core, this is a tug-of-war between interests and ideals.

America engages the world not only – and arguably not primarily – to promote freedom, but to keep the enemies of freedom at bay. America engages the world – and maintains a military with global reach and global presence – not to go looking for problems, but to address problems before they explode into something unmanageable or unthinkable. That was the lesson of 1941 – a lesson many Americans have overlooked in the wake of the interventions in Afghanistan and Iraq.

In an earlier period of disengagement and doubt, President Gerald Ford challenged both the idealists and the realists by urging Americans to "accept the responsibilities of leadership" and reject the notion that "if we do not succeed in everything everywhere, then we have succeeded in nothing anywhere."

With the American people wearied by the burdens of engagement, hyperactive interventionism isn't politically sustainable. But with aggressive authoritarian regimes literally trying to roll back the free world, inward-looking isolationism isn't an option, either. ### **Disaster Preparedness and Relief**

National Preparedness Month, sponsored by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and held annually in September, is a reminder that disasters can strike at any time. It's important to have a planned response when you're at work, on vacation or on the road.

The National Safety Council offers safety tips specific on preparing for <u>earthquakes</u>, <u>floods</u>, <u>hurricanes</u> and <u>tornadoes</u>, and how to minimize <u>fire risks</u>.

Federal agencies, like <u>Ready.gov</u> and the <u>National Oceanic and</u> <u>Atmospheric Administration</u> also are valuable resources for emergency preparedness. When you face a natural or man-made emergency, try to stay informed through radio, TV or the Internet. In some cases, however, cable, electric and cell phone service will be disabled, making communication nearly impossible. The National Safety Council recommends the following general precautions that apply to many disaster situations:

- Make sure at least one family member knows first aid and CPR
- Download the FEMA app for resources, weather alerts and safety tips
- Have a family communication plan in place; all members of the family should review and practice the plan
- Have all important phone numbers written down or memorized
- Have an emergency kit in your car and at least three days of food and water at home
- Be sure to store all important documents birth certificates,
  - insurance policies, etc. in a fire-proof safe or safety deposit box • Know how to shut off utilities

### **High School Oratorical Contest**

Right now, is when you should be working on your local High School Oratorical Contest. Please reach out to your schools and start looking for those kids who might want to get involved. If you're worried about a place to hold your contest if your Post will not suffice, then talk to your schools and see if you can utilize their facilities, you can also reach out to another local Post that might be willing to let you use their facilities. Check with your District Commanders, they may be able to assist you. Contestants are expected to go online and obtain the information needed (http://www.legion.org/oratorical). The Registration/Certification form is available on the Department web site and is now fillable as well as a page with the Assigned Topics and links to the National information. I have included 'hard' copies of both in this Bulletin.

## The 2024 National Finals will be May 17-19 in Hillsdale, Mich., at Hillsdale College. Quarterfinal and semifinal contests are scheduled for Saturday, May 18 with the finals scheduled for Sunday, May 19.

All contestants and chaperones will arrive the Friday of the contest weekend. All contestants and chaperones will stay on campus at Hillsdale College.

A mandatory pre-contest orientation session for all contestants will take place the Friday evening of the contest weekend. A banquet honoring all contestants will be Sunday afternoon, following the national championship contest.

## **Oratorical Contest Assigned Topics**

The assigned topic discourse must not consume less than three (3) minutes or more than five (5) minutes for delivery. The purpose of the assigned topic discourse is to test the speaker's knowledge of the subject, the extent of his or her research, and the ability to discuss the topic as related to the basic principles of government under the Constitution. The assigned topic shall be drawn by the contest official in full view of the audience immediately before the last speaker begins delivery of his or her prepared oration and will be made known to the audience and each contestant approximately five (5) minutes prior to the time of delivery. The topic will be on some phase of the U.S. Constitution, selected from Articles and Sections as listed under assigned topics for the current year's contest in this brochure.

All contestants at each contest level are required to speak in the English language on the same assigned topic.

## **Assigned Topics for 2024 Oratorical Contest**

**Amendment II** – A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

**Amendment XXIII** – The District constituting the seat of Government of the United States shall appoint in such manner as the Congress may direct:

A number of electors of President and Vice President equal to the whole number of Senators and Representatives in Congress to which the District would be entitled if it were a State, but in no event more than the least populous State; they shall be in addition to those appointed by the State, but they shall be considered, for the purposes of the election of President and Vice President, to be electors appointed by a State; and they shall meet in the District and perform such duties as provided by the twelfth article of amendment.

**Amendment XXV, Section 3** – Whenever the President transmits to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives his written declaration that he is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, and until he transmits to them a written declaration to the contrary, such powers and duties shall be discharged by the Vice President as Acting President.

**Amendment V** – No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a grand jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the militia, when in actual service in time of war or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, not be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.


