This month the primary focus is on **Making Buddy Checks Happen**. We need to reach out to our comrades on a regular basis. Buddy Checks benefit us and our comrades on so many levels.

Below are tips on how to organize a Buddy Check.

1. Gather up a team. If each member in a team of ten contacts just 10 Legionnaires or former Legionnaires, one hundred veterans can be reached in one sitting.

2. Get your list of members and former members. You can download them from MyLegion.org

3. Divide up the call list among your team members. Some may have personal connections with the member or the former member and should make that particular buddy check.

4. Start making connections – either from a quiet place inside the post or from your home – to see how the members and former members are doing, ask if they need anything and invite them to any event or activity planned.

5. Make sure you thank the member or former member at the end of your call.

6. If the member or former member wishes to renew, be sure to have your post's payment procedure at your fingertips, the address to send a check.

8. Leave contact information in case the member or former member can't take the call or needs anything in the future.

VA S.A.V.E. TRAINING FOUR WAYS YOU CAN HELP A VETERAN IN CRISIS

What is VA S.A.V.E. Training?

VA S.A.V.E. Training is a free, brief online or in-person course that will help you act with care and compassion if you come across a Veteran who is in crisis or having thoughts of suicide. The acronym S.A.V.E. helps you remember the important steps involved in suicide prevention:



Know the Signs that indicate a Veteran might be thinking about suicide

A

Ask the most important question of all — "Are you thinking of killing yourself?"



Validate the Veteran's experience



Encourage treatment and Expedite getting help





Keep these tips in mind when talking with a Veteran who may be at risk for suicide:

- Remain calm
- Listen more than you speak
- Maintain eye contact
- Act with confidence
- Do not argue
- Use open body language
- Limit questions—Let the Veteran do the talking
- Use supportive, hopeful comments
- Be honest—There are no quick solutions, but help is available

Know the *Signs* that indicate a Veteran may be thinking about suicide

The signs below may indicate that a Veteran needs help. If you or a Veteran you know is experiencing any of these, contact the Veterans Crisis Line:

- Hopelessness, feeling like there's no way out
- Anxiety, agitation, sleeplessness, or mood swings
- Feeling like there's no reason to live
- Rage or anger
- Engaging in risky activities without thinking
- Increasing alcohol or drug use
- Withdrawing from family and friends

The signs below require immediate attention. If you or a Veteran you know is experiencing any of these and needs medical attention, call 911 now:

- When asked, they express a desire to hurt or kill themself
- When prompted, they reveal they're looking for ways to die by suicide
- They talk about death, dying, or suicide
- They begin to exhibit self-destructive behavior, such as increased drug or alcohol use, talking about obtaining/ using weapons for self-harm, or saving up medication

A Ask the most important question of all: "Are you thinking of killing yourself?"

Other ways to ask the question include: "Are you thinking of suicide?" or "Have you had thoughts about taking your own life?"

When asking the question, remember:

- **DO** ask the question if you've identified warning signs
- **DO** ask the question in such a way that's natural and flows with the conversation
- DON'T ask the question as though you're looking for a "no" answer ("You're not thinking of killing yourself, are you?")
- **DON'T** wait to ask the question until they're halfway out the door



Validate the Veteran's experience

Use the following steps to let the Veteran know you're listening and acknowledge their experience:

- Talk openly about suicide. Be willing to listen, allow the Veteran to express their feelings, and make supportive, encouraging comments.
- Recognize the situation is serious
- Don't pass judgement

Encourage treatment and *Expedite* getting help

If a Veteran is having thoughts of suicide, remain calm and reassure them help is available:

- DON'T keep the Veteran's suicidal behavior a secret
- DON'T leave them alone
- Try to get the Veteran to seek immediate help from their doctor or the nearest hospital or emergency room
- Call 911

Safety is Important

Never negotiate with someone who has a gun. Get to safety and call 911. If the Veteran has taken pills, cut themself, or has done harm to themself in some way, call 911.

Why communities are critical in preventing Veteran suicide

Approximately half of Veterans receive care outside VA. VA is dedicated to reaching all Veterans where they live and connect. To do this, VA and communities are coming together to implement the public health approach, combining community and clinical interventions for suicide prevention. Together, VA and communities can work toward ending Veteran suicide.


What you can do

We invite communities to partner with our community engagement and partnership coordinators to enhance suicide prevention efforts. Community partners may include:

- Community mental health organizations, Veterans Service Organizations, or homeless organizations
- Mental health providers
- First responders or members of the clergy
- Representatives of a municipality, business, recreational organization or club, or health agency
- · Veterans, service members, or members of their families
- Gun shop owners or employees
- Community members

How it works

VA uses evidence-based interventions to reach Veterans through multiple touchpoints at the local, state, and national levels.



Priority areas of focus



Identify service members, Veterans, and their families and screen for suicide risk



Promote connectedness and improve care transitions



Increase lethal means safety and safety planning

How to start

Contact your nearest community engagement partnership coordinator (CEPC), who may help the community identify care needs and opportunities for support and facilitate coalition efforts for suicide prevention public health strategies.

CEPCs are available to assist communities with:

- Coalition building and assisting with organizing coalition leadership
- Logistical and technical support
- Conducting needs assessments and environmental scans
- Program evaluation
- Data surveillance
- Action planning
- Knowledge about VA
- Suicide prevention training
- · Outreach and education related to suicide prevention strategies

If you're passionate about supporting Veterans, join us. You can make a difference in a unified effort to prevent Veteran suicide.
