- C. When additional space is needed, please use other side of form. If further space is needed use plain stationery of the same (8 1/2 x 11) size and attach to application.
- D. **Do not use same programs for different awards. Apply only for what award calls for.**
- E. News clippings in support of any award should be copied on 8 1/2 x 11 paper and include date.

2026 DEPARTMENT AWARDS

AMERICANISM

1. **THE JAMES A. WEIR AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post doing the best work in Youth Activities as set up in the Americanism Program, (American Legion Boys' State; Oratorical Contest; Scouting; 4-H Club; Baseball; S.A.L.; and similarly sponsored work), with the total accomplishments in any or all these programs to govern the award. Information must be consistent with data on submitted CPR. The committee may opt to present two awards (large and small post).
2. **THE JOHN P. GRIFFIN AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post judged as making the most outstanding endeavors in the field of Child Welfare.
3. **THE JOHN N. ROBERTO AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which under Awards Committee rules shall be chosen as having shown the greatest participation and work on the promotion of Patriotic Observances and Americanism in the local schools and community. Information must be consistent with data on submitted CPR.
4. **THE HENRY S. BIALOGLOWY AWARD:** Awarded annually to the American Legion Post, which according to Department Awards Committee rules shall have made the greatest contribution to the display, promotion, presentation, and education on the American Flag.
5. **THE WILLIAM MAGER AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post sponsoring the MOST UNUSUAL program in the field of Children & Youth. (Use General Form)
6. **THE JOSEPH F. MARDU AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post sponsoring the most outstanding School Awards Program as an Americanism endeavor.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

7. **THE ARTHUR J. KELLY - LEO M. HINDSLEY AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post showing the greatest accomplishment in community services to the benefit of the entire community. (Use General Form information needed – type of program, is it continuing, portion of community that benefits, post sole sponsor, or jointly sponsored)
8. **THE LEWIS E. WALLER AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post having shown the greatest participation and work in caring for homeless veterans
9. **PAUL I. SPEDALIERE PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to any individual(s) of a District, Post, Unit or Squadron that promotes the theme of "Unity and Teamwork, Build Our Future" by either holding an event or creating a project which reflects the Four Pillars that embraces the entire American Legion Family.

INDIVIDUAL

9. THE POST HISTORIANS PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post Historian who shall register in Department Headquarters the most outstanding Scrapbook record or Narrative of the current year's activities.

PLEASE NOTE: Deadline for Historian Awards is June 1st

10. THE HERBERT L. EMANUELSON AWARD: Awarded annually to the individual Legionnaire who has rendered the most outstanding contributions to Community Service.

13. THE RICHARD W. ANDERSON PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that Legionnaire in the Department of Connecticut, who actively supports, promotes, and participates in The American Legion Americanism Program as sponsored by the Posts.

14. THE EDWARD J. CARNEY JR. PLAQUE: Awarded to the Legionnaire recruiting the most NEW Legionnaires in the current Legion year, (July 1- June 1), as verified by the Post and Department. (Use General Form and new members with ID numbers).

15. THE RICHARD Wm. ANDERSON PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the Legionnaire who, having the foresight to seek and implement solutions to the challenges facing the American Legion Post of tomorrow, prepares his/her post to accept the challenges today.

16. PETER LOUX "SERGEANT-AT-ARMS OF THE YEAR" PLAQUE: Awarded to Post, District or Department Sgt.-at-Arms who, in the opinion of the awards committee, exemplifies the highest values of service to the American Legion, Community, State and Nation, along with excellence and leadership.

17. THE ARTHUR ST. JOHN PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the individual S.A.L. member who according to the Department Awards Committee has been chosen as the most Outstanding Son in a Squadron of The Sons of The American Legion for the current year. This is to be accomplished by each Squadron (or Post) submitting a nomination to the Department Awards Committee who shall judge such nominations on the outstanding way the S.A.L. member has contributed to the programs of the S.A.L. and The American Legion.

18. THE BOYD SAXTON PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the Post and/or District Chaplain who has exhibited spiritual guidance and performed the most duties of their office.

19. THE NEALE V. CABRAL PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the Post Adjutant who according to the Department Awards Committee has served in an outstanding manner in performing his or her duties.

20. HARRY R. "BUTCH" HANSEN JR. PLAQUE: Awarded to the individual transferring the most members from Post 200 (current or expired) into his or her Post during the current membership year, (1 July – 1 May) as verified by the Post and the Department Adjutant.

21. MEDIA RELATIONS AWARD: Awarded annually to that Legionnaire in the Department of Connecticut, who actively supports, educates, and participates in promoting The American Legion Department of Connecticut's Media Relations Program, regardless of media (printed, copied or electronic). Support material must be attached.

POST ACTIVITIES

22. **THE CHARLES J. MAJEWSKI AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which according to Department Awards Committee rules is judged to have the most all-inclusive Post activities program between June 1st and the subsequent Memorial Day.
23. **THE HUGH C. GRAHAM AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which is judged to have had the most outstanding and diversified Public Relations Program to promote the best interest of all-American Legion programs?
24. **THE EUGENE W. FREEMAN AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which does the most toward encouraging interest and work on National Security at community and national levels.
25. **THE GEORGE D. BARON AWARD:** Awarded annually to the American Legion Post which prepares and sends to its members the most outstanding and newsworthy Post Publication (Bulletins, Newsletters, Newspapers, emailed file) regardless of media (printed, copied, electronic).
26. **JAMES A. LACOURSIERE, JR. PLAQUE:** Awarded to the Post that best involves itself in the Heroes to Hometown (H2H), the Troop Support Services (TS2), the Reconnect Program, Family Support, and/or Operation Comfort Warriors (OCW)
27. **THE NATIONAL GUARD AWARD:** Awarded annually to the post that makes the greatest per capita contribution to the Connecticut National Guard Foundation, Inc. Submit General Form with a copy of cancelled check. Tie breaker – goes to the post with the highest percentage of their membership goal as of June 1 of the award year.
28. **THE FRANCIS G. GARRIS AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which according to the Department Awards Committee has been judged to have exhibited the greatest effort in promoting the Scouting Program (any & all elements of BSA)
29. **THE CHET D. HIRSH/ THE SYDNEY P. SIMONS AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American legion Post which sponsors the best program in environmental ecology?
30. **THE REV. ROBERT G. KEATING AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which shall have shown the greatest accomplishment in religious emphasis of The American Legion during the current year, such as promotion of Religious Emphasis Week and Four Chaplains Sunday.

VETERANS AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION

31. JOSEPH G. LEONARD - JOHN W. CLARKE PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the individual American Legion Post Service Officer who has excelled in service work by servicing veterans and their dependents in a manner that has brought outstanding records of achievement in securing claims and benefits.
32. THE RAYMOND R. BIGELOW PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the Post doing the most to promote the VAVS and RHVS programs in the VA Medical Centers and Rocky Hill.
33. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS PHYSICIAN OF THE YEAR PLAQUE:
Awarded to a Veterans Affairs Physician who according to the Department of Connecticut Veterans and Rehabilitation Commission has provided extraordinary service to our nation's Veterans.

"Automatic" DEPARTMENT AWARDS

Awards listed below are 'automatic', i.e. determined by HQ or elsewhere. They are earned and can NOT be applied for. They will be awarded for accomplishments during the current membership year (June 1 – May 31).

34. THE LIONEL F. DUGAS AWARD: Awarded annually to that American Legion District which will stimulate the highest percentage of Posts submitting the Consolidated Post Report (CPR) by June 1st.
35. THE EDWARD H. LYNCH, JR. AWARD: Awarded annually to the American Legion Post who is the sponsor of the recipient of the Department Americanism Award.
36. THE W. FRAZIER BRINLEY PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the individual raising the greatest amount of money at the Annual Walk-A-Thon for Connecticut's Kids and our Children's Hospital.
37. THE EVERETT G. SHEPARD III PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the Post or Organization sponsoring the winner of the Department Commander's Award at State Police Youth Week.

LEGISLATIVE (Automatic)

38. THE THOMAS K. MOORE PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the Post Commander with the highest percentage of members verified to be registered through The American Legion's Grassroots Legislative Action Center. This award may be presented to more than one Post Commander

MEMBERSHIP (Automatic)

39. THE PHILO C. CALHOUN AWARD: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post of the Department, which is the first to equal its previous year's membership. *(Awarded automatically)
40. THE CLARENCE W. SEYMOUR AWARD: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which makes the greatest percentage gain in membership over the previous year. *(Awarded automatically)
41. THE MORGAN B. HAVEN AWARD: Awarded to that American Legion Post which has the greatest percentage of its previous year's membership renewed by January 1st. *(Awarded automatically)
42. THE HOWARD I. JACOBS AWARD: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post with a membership goal of 50-100, 101-300 and 301 and above which on December 31st has the greatest numerical membership percentage in the Department of Connecticut. *(Awarded automatically)
43. THE LEROY B. BUTLER PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post having the greatest numerical advance in membership for the new year on Veterans Day, November 11th. *(Awarded automatically)
44. THE JOHN F. SPAIN PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post with a membership of 100 to 500 members, which shall have five (5) consecutive years or more of Quota membership. *(Awarded automatically)
45. THE JOSEPH W. TARRANT, JR. PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post which enrolled the most NEW MEMBERS for the current membership year. *(Awarded automatically)
46. THE ELIOTT N. MORRIS PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post with a goal of 200 to 500 members or a goal over 500 members which on the closing day of the Mid-Winter Conference has the greatest percentage of Quota into Department. *(Awarded automatically)
47. **THE D. JOSEPH JACKSON PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the American Legion Post, which is the first to achieve ALL-TIME HIGH status in membership in the current membership year. *(Awarded automatically)
48. THE FRANK H. BUTTERWORTH PLAQUE: Awarded annually to that American Legion Post showing the greatest numerical gain in membership over the previous year. *(Awarded automatically)

PROGRAMS (AUTOMATIC)

49. **THE JOHN S. BABES AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post, which sponsors the boy, elected as Governor of the current session of Boys' State. *(Awarded automatically)
50. **THE DEPARTMENT BASEBALL AWARD:** Awarded annually to that Post which shall sponsor the Baseball Team winning the Department Championship
51. **THE MILTON E. MORITZ AWARD:** Awarded annually to that *American Legion Post or other organization* sponsoring the Troop of the Eagle Scout chosen as Scout of the Year.
52. **THE WILLIAM H. JORDAN AWARD:** Awarded annually to the Post sponsoring the boy chosen by the Boys' State Commission who has combined the spirit of God and Country with the motto "SEMPER FI".
53. **THE ELIOTT K. BURR MEMORIAL AWARD:** Awarded annually to that American Legion Post sponsoring the boy at Boys' State showing the most outstanding participation in the Religious Program for the current session.
54. **THE K. ROBERT LEWIS PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the individual who has been judged the winner of the Department Oratorical contest, based on their presentation and knowledge of the United State Constitution and duties of American citizens.

SPECIALTY AWARDS

55. **ANNUAL FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE YEAR PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to that Volunteer, Call or Paid Fire Department of any town or city that while in the pursuit of their profession and by exceptional performance of duty brings credit to that Fire Department and the Community for performance in the field of public safety, Children & Youth, Community Awareness Projects, and participation in Patriotic Observances.
56. **POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE YEAR:** Awarded annually to that Police Department of any town or city, or State Police Barracks, that brings credit to that Police Department for performance in the field of Children and Youth, Drug Education, Community Awareness Projects, and participation in Patriotic Observances.
57. **JOHN C. LAFONTAINE PLAQUE** to the "Emergency Services Person of the Year": Awarded annually to that member of any Volunteer, Call or Paid Fire Department who while in the pursuit of their profession and by exceptional performance of duty has brought credit to their Fire Department, the Community and to themselves during the current year and by conducting themselves in this manner has earned the highest respect of The American Legion, Department of Connecticut.
58. **LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE YEAR:** Awarded to the Law Enforcement Officer meeting the criteria specified on list following application (enclosed with this awards package or found at: <http://www.legion.org/security/officeraward>). If documentation requirements are met, then the Department winner will be forwarded to National for consideration of National Award.

59. **FIRE FIGHTER OF THE YEAR:** Awarded annually to that member of any Volunteer, ON Call or Paid Certified Fire Fighter who while in the pursuit of their profession and by exceptional performance of duty has brought credit to their Fire Department, the Community and to themselves during the current year and by conducting themselves in this manner has earned the highest respect of The American Legion, Department of Connecticut. The winner of the Fighter of the Year Award will be forwarded to The American Legion National Head Quarters to be considered for the National Fire Fighter of the Year.
60. **THE LOUIS E. MOLINARO PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the Post commander who according to the Department Awards Committee has been chosen as the most outstanding Post Commander of the current year.
61. **THE E. GUY MILLER PLAQUE** Awarded annually to the District Sr. Vice-Commander who has been most active within their District, particularly with respect to promoting membership.
*(Awarded automatically)
62. **THE HENRY MAYER PLAQUE:** Awarded annually to the District Commander selected as “District Commander of the Year” based on a point system, which is on file in the Department Adjutant’s office. *(Awarded automatically)
63. **LEGIONNAIRE OF THE YEAR PLAQUE:** Three (3) nominations are preferred by the Awards Committee for the award to be made. Award is based on activities of nominee and outstanding and unusual service performed by the nominee to The American Legion during the year ending since last convention.
64. **DEPARTMENT MEMBERSHIP RECRUITER OF THE YEAR:** Awarded annually to that Legionnaire who has recruited more new members than any other Legionnaire for the Department.
65. **NATIONAL GOLD BRIGADE AWARD:** Awarded annually by the National American Legion to that Legionnaire who successfully recruits 50 or more new members.
66. **DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS HEALTH CARE PROVIDER OF THE YEAR PLAQUE:** Awarded to a Veterans Health-Care Provider who according to the Department of Connecticut Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Commission who has provided extraordinary service to our Nations Veterans.

RETIRED AWARDS

Law Enforcement Officer of The Year Application Process

Purpose: The purpose of this letter of instruction is to specify the guidelines, eligibility criteria, and application requirements for selection and presentation of the "Department Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award." Our goal is to select a well-rounded Law Enforcement Officer who has exceeded, above and beyond, the duty requirements expected of his/her position and has demonstrated a distinct pattern of community service coupled with professional achievement. Episodes of heroism will, of course, also be included where noted. Major secondary purpose of this award is to encourage the further development of the department and post Law and Order as well as Homeland Security Committees. It is firmly believed that establishing this award will further serve to promote the public trust and support of our law enforcement agencies.

Award Designation: This award shall be known as "The American Legion Department Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award," It will be presented annually at the Department convention or other suitable American Legion settings, as appropriate. All posts are encouraged to participate in this worthwhile and prestigious award program.

Guidelines for Posts:

- a. All posts are urged to select a Law Enforcement Officer of the Year before the award deadline. Posts should submit their nominee's application to The American Legion, Attn: Awards Committee, 269 Main St Cromwell CT 06416. It is desired that posts select and submit their nominees so that postmarked applications are received no later than May 15th to allow adequate judging and notification time prior to the Department convention.
- b. The inclusive dates for this award cover the calendar year January 1 through December 31 and until the following deadline for submission to the Awards Committee.
- c. Posts may submit only one nominee per year. Once a nominee has been entered in the "The American Legion Department Law Enforcement of the Year Award" competition, he or she will not be allowed to be submitted for another year.
- d. The resume and application for the nominee from each post must conform to the Department criteria for judging as contained herein. The eligibility and criteria stated in this letter will select the Department Law Enforcement Officer of the Year.

Eligibility Criteria: To be eligible for consideration, nominees must meet the following.

- a. Be a citizen of the United States, male or female.
- b. Be a living, active, full-time, and paid, sworn law enforcement officer entrusted with full authority and the powers of arrest.
- c. Consideration for a posthumous award will be acceptable only if the nominee's death has occurred after the department's selection and within the dates for which the award is being presented.
- d. Be assigned to, or fully recognized by, Municipal, County, District, State Police, University Police, Highway Patrol, Sheriff's office, or as a sworn federal law enforcement officer FBI, Secret Service Agent, United States Federal Marshal, Park Police, Capitol Police, civilian special agents 1811s with AFOSI, Army CID, CGIS, NCIS, and USMC CID.
- e. Be selected as the Post Law Enforcement Officer of the Year.
- f. Post nominees are not required to be veterans or members of The American Legion.
- g. Reside and be assigned or attached for duty in the area from which they are selected.
- h. Nominees selected for this award should be available to receive this award at The American Legion Department Convention.
- i. Military police officers or investigators are not eligible for participation in this award

Application Packets: Only one copy of the application packet must be submitted to the Department. Post application packets for their nominee should include:

- 1) a completed application form,
- 2) a 5" x 7" photograph of the nominee, and
- 3) a maximum of 18 one-sided pages 8 1/2" x 11" bond paper of service documentation. The first six or seven pages should contain the individual's service narrative. The additional pages may include supporting citations and other documentation including press articles.

Only one copy of the application package needs to be submitted. The following documentation should be included:

a. Application form - Complete the attached application form and use it as the cover page of the application. This cover page shall not count as part of the maximum 18 pages of service documentation.

b. 5" x 7" official photograph of the nominee.

c. Service narrative and supporting documentation. The goal of the Department Law and Order & Homeland Security Committee is to select a well-rounded law enforcement officer who has exceeded, above and beyond, the duty requirements of his or her position and who exemplifies the virtues of professionalism and dedication, and has demonstrated a distinct pattern of community service to his/her community, state or nation; and also has proven his/her dedication to societal security and protection. The law enforcement officer must be recommended by his/her Commanding Officer or Supervisor for this award. The commanding officer or supervisor should also state that the law enforcement officer will be available for its presentation at the Department convention if selected for this award. Specific acts of Community service, heroism, and meritorious performance recognized by his/her law enforcement agency should be included and documented. To assist departments in their selections, judging guidelines at the Department level will be based on the following criteria, and maximum percentage points will be allocated as follows:

I Community Service.....35 points

II Professional Career.....40 points

III Heroism.....20 points

IV Letters of Recognition, news clippings,
and other substantiating documentation.....5 points

d. Community Service: Outstanding service to the community, state, or nation by the officer, in both on-duty and off-duty activities, should be explained for the past year and may include previous years. Cite, for example, awards and/or supporting letters from city or county commissioners, letters from state officials, letters from The American Legion department or

Posts, or citizens attesting to and commanding the officer for their community service contributions. Remember, one of the major aims of the award program is to select a well-rounded law enforcement officer who has demonstrated a distinct pattern of community service, above and beyond assigned duty requirements.

e. Citations for community service, heroism, and meritorious performance of duty should be explained for the past year and may include previous years. Include citations and any supporting letters from the officer's chain of command as well as other documentation from city, county, state authorities, and American Legion officials, citizens, or civic groups as further evidence of community service, heroic and meritorious performance of duty by the officer.

f. Include a copy of your nominee's state or federal certification as a law enforcement officer as well as copies of pertinent training and education certificates as appropriate.

g. The Post which submits the winning nominee will be notified by Department HQ as expeditiously as possible. Remember to let your nominee know what "The American Legion Department Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award" is and receive assurance from the officer's chain of command that if your nominee is selected as the winner, they will be available for the award presentation at the Department convention. If the winning officer is a uniformed officer, then they are requested to appear in full uniform at the Department convention at the time of presentation. Non-uniformed winners would be expected to appear in appropriate business attire.

Department Judging: Applicants will be judged by members of the Homeland Security Committee.

In the event the Department winner is unable to be present to receive his/her award at the Department convention, The American Legion Department Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award will be accepted by the winner's American Legion post commander at the Department convention on behalf of the winner for presentation at an appropriate post ceremony.

Episodes of heroism will, of course, also be included where noted. Major secondary purpose of this award is to encourage the further development of the department and post Law and Order as well as Homeland Security Committees.. It is firmly believed that the establishment of this award will further serve to promote the public trust and support of our firefighter agencies.

Award Designation: This award shall be known as "The American Legion Firefighter of the Year Award" and it will be presented annually at the Department convention or other suitable American Legion settings, as appropriate. All Post are encouraged to participate in this worthwhile and prestigious award program.

Guidelines for Posts:

a. All Posts are urged to select a Firefighter of the Year before the award deadline. Posts should submit their nominee's application to The American Legion, Attn: Awards Committee, 269 Main St Cromwell CT 06416. It is desired that posts select and submit their nominees so that postmarked applications are received no later than May 15th to allow adequate judging and notification time prior to the Department convention.

b The inclusive dates for this award cover the calendar year January 1 through December 31 and until the following deadline for submission to the Awards Committee.

c. Posts may submit only one nominee per year and their nominee must have been the previous year Department award winner. Once a nominee has been entered in The American Legion Department Firefighter of the Year Award competition, he or she will not be allowed to be submitted for another year.

d. The resume and application for the nominee from each Department must conform to the Department criteria for judging as contained herein. The eligibility and criteria stated in this letter will be used to select the Department Firefighter of the Year.

Eligibility Criteria: To be eligible for consideration, nominees must meet the following.

a. Be a citizen of the United States, male or female.

b. Be a certified, living, active, full-time, paid, or volunteer firefighter.

c. Consideration for a posthumous award will be acceptable only if the nominee's death has occurred after the department's selection and within the dates for which the award is being presented.

d. Be assigned to, or fully recognized by, Municipal (City), County, District, State or Federal firefighter.

e. Be selected as the Post Firefighter of the Year.

f. Department nominees are not required to be veterans or members of The American Legion.

g. Reside and be assigned or attached for duty in the area from which they are selected.

h. Nominees selected for this award should be available to receive this award at The American Legion Department Convention.

i. Military firefighters are eligible for participation in this award provided they are state firefighter certified.

Application Packets: Only one copy of the Department application packet needs to be submitted to the Department Security Division. Department application packets for their nominee should include:

- 1) a completed application form.
- 2) a 5x photograph of the nominee.
- 3) a maximum of 18 one-sided pages 8 1/2x 11 bond paper of service documentation. The first six or seven pages should contain the individual's service narrative. The additional pages may include supporting citations and other documentation including press articles. Only one copy of the application package needs to be submitted.

The following documentation should be included:

a. Application form - Complete the attached application form and use it as the cover page of the application. This cover page shall not count as part of the maximum 18 pages of service documentation.

b. 5 x 7 official photograph of the nominee.

c. Service narrative and supporting documentation. The goal of the Department Law and Order & Homeland Security Committee is to select a well-rounded firefighter who has exceeded, above and beyond, the duty requirements of his or her position and who exemplifies the virtues of professionalism and dedication and has demonstrated a distinct pattern of community service to his/her community, state or nation; and also, has proven his/her personal dedication to community security and protection. The firefighter officer must be recommended by his/her Commanding Officer or Supervisor for this award. The commanding officer or supervisor should also state that the firefighter officer, if selected for this award, will be available for its presentation at the Department convention. Specific acts of community service, heroism and meritorious performance recognized by his/her firefighter agency should be included and documented. To assist Post in their selections, judging guidelines at the Department level will be based on the following criteria, and maximum percentage points will be allocated as follows:

I Community Service35 points

II Professional Career40 points

III Heroism.....20 points

IV Letters of Recognition, news clippings,
and other substantiating documentation.....5 points

d. Community Service: Outstanding service to the community, state or nation by the firefighter, in both on-duty and off-duty activities, should be explained for the past year and may include previous years. Cite, for example, awards and/or supporting letters from city or county commissioners, letters from state officials, and letters from The American Legion Department or

Posts, or from citizens attesting to and commending the firefighter for their community service contributions. Remember, one of the major aims of the award program is to select a well-rounded firefighter officer who has demonstrated a distinct pattern of community service, above and beyond assigned duty requirements.

e. Citations for community service, heroism, and meritorious performance of duty should be explained for the past year and may include previous years. Include citations and any supporting letters from the officer's chain of command as well as other documentation from city, county, state authorities, and American Legion officials, citizens, or civic groups as further evidence of community service, heroic and meritorious performance of duty by the officer.

f. Include a copy of your nominee's state or federal certification as Firefighter as well as copies of pertinent training and education certificates as appropriate.

g. The Post which submits the winning nominee will be notified by Department HQ as expeditiously as possible. Remember to let your nominee know what "The American Legion Department Firefighter of the Year Award" is and receive assurance from the officer's chain of command that if your nominee is selected as the winner, they will be available for the award presentation at the Department convention. If the winning officer is a uniformed officer, then they are requested to appear in full uniform at the Department convention at the time of presentation. Non-uniformed winners would be expected to appear in appropriate business attire.

Department Judging: Applicants will be judged by members of the Homeland Security Committee.

In the event the Department winner is unable to be present to receive his/her award at the Department convention, The American Legion Department Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award will be accepted by the winner's American Legion post commander at the Department convention on behalf of the winner for presentation at an appropriate post ceremony.
